Glenn Super, longtime comedian known for many years as "Mr. Bullhorn" and opened for major acts in major venues, died Sept. 22 of prostate cancer in Greenwich, Conn. He was 50.

Super received his nickname because of his use of the prop to emphasize punch lines. Super performed in Las Vegas, Trump Castle in Atlantic city, the Hollywood Bowl, Greek Theater and Universal Amphitheater in Los Angeles.

He served as George Carlin's opening act for four years and also opened for the Beach Boys, Air Supply, Julio Iglesias and James Brown.

On the small screen, he appeared on "The Merv Griffin Show," "Live With Regis and Kathie Lee," "Evening at the Improv" and "Sports Off Beat," a show he conceived, hosted and produced and which was seen on Prime Ticket and Fox Sports.

He appeared as "Mr. Bullhorn" in the 1984 feature "Where the Boys Are" and in 1980's "Gorp."

He is survived by wife Patty and two sons.

A memorial service will be held Sunday at Temple Emanuel in Great Neck, N.Y.
